

A Word From the Pastor

When I was a youth ministry intern in California, a wise visitation pastor gave a valuable piece of advice when I asked about the most important thing he'd learned in ministry: he said simply, **"Keep the main thing the main thing."**

During the past month, keeping the main thing in the forefront of our minds – as pastors – has been difficult. The new normal is anything but, thanks to a Coronavirus that has spread throughout the world. A few weeks ago, the thought of allowing less than 10 people in a church for Sunday worship seemed ludicrous, yet Pastor Mary and I were collaborating with Dale Hennessy and Sue Rosenbaum to coordinate a live stream while pleading with folks not to risk infection by social distancing from one another – this after our previous week's on-site service where we invited our congregation to "**greet one another in the name of Christ**" during church, potentially getting everyone sick by letting them hug each other.

Other similar sorts of questions popped up as we thought of ministry, none of which were topics of seminary classes decades ago or within the contexts of previous church situations I'd been a part of: (1) do we continue to do our month of Meals on Wheels ministry to a half dozen families, most elderly and the most vulnerable to any colds, flu symptoms, or viruses in general?; (2) how do we keep in touch with our parishioners via Facebook, email, phone calls, etc. and do so with care, knowing that their well-being took on more than spiritual dimensions; (3) what events should be cancelled for the sake of our people, including hosting an Easter sunrise worship service on April 12 that had us on the hook for providing breakfast for folks from three local congregations – **yes**, **Sunrise service is cancelled, no, we haven't made a decision on live streaming or having the on-site, normal Easter 10:30 a.m. worship service.**

But I'm sure it hasn't been any easier for educators, most in the U.S. are teaching online to students after years of face-to-face process. And for doctors, nurses, and other hospital staff, the process in which they've had to do their jobs has been complicated by the fact that (due to the spread of COVID-19), they must be worrying about their own safety even as they attempt to save the lives of thousands who've been infected. Or what about the board members and workers of retirement communities and care facilities that have had to quarantine themselves? They are all due our thanks, as are our grocery store and pharmacy owners and the truck drivers and other delivery folks that keep those entities in needed supplies.

So I'm back at the computer, trying to remind myself of the main thing – and thankfully, the apostle Paul hammered it home in the opening verses of I Corinthians 15. In the three previous chapters, he'd been discussing the spiritual gifts of Christ following church bodies. Some people had been so Continued on Page 2

concerned with what gifts they had (and puffing themselves up about it) that they'd forgotten why they were the church in the first place. And here's how he begins I Corinthians 15, the initial 11 verses:

"Now, brothers and sisters. I want to remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received and on which you've taken your stand. By this gospel you are saved, if you hold firmly to the word I preached to you. Otherwise, you've believed in vain. For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas (Peter), and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than 500 of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles, and last of all he appeared to me also, as to one abnormally born."

He continued, "For I am the least of the apostles and do not even deserve to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am who I am, and his grace to me was not in vain. No, I worked harder than the rest – yet not I, but the grace of God that was with me. Whether, then, it is I or they, this is what we preach, and this is what you believed."

This gospel reminds me that what's going on this spring won't be the end of the story, even if it's reading like a pretty bizarre chapter. This gospel will save us, its author already has done so. As we enter further into the Easter season, we hope, even if hopelessness may creep up on the world a bit. Because of Jesus, we resurrect our spirits, even as we remember the Lord's resurrection.
