# **Resurrection Reminders**

There were a number of spiritual exercises that our 10-person **"Deeper in Christ"** participants tried during five days at an Episcopal retreat center near Memphis, TN a week ago. One of them was reading a text from the gospel of John in a **"Lectio Divina"** that incorporates multiple looks at scripture with various perspectives from which to read from. As I considered the end of the Lenten season from this text, I thought of a few things to share.

John 1:35-39 – "The next day John again was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he exclaimed, 'Look, here is the Lamb of God!' The two disciples heard him say this, and they followed Jesus. When Jesus turned and saw them following, he said to them, 'What are you looking for?' They said to him, 'Rabbi,' (which translated means Teacher), 'Where are you staying?' He said to them, 'Come and see.' They came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon.

My first revelation from this text is where John the Baptist announced to his disciples, **"Look, here is the** Lamb of God!"

We don't get this from our text, but the two disciples who ask this question are disciples of John the Baptist first. John has prepared the way; he's told them that, eventually, there would be someone more worthy for them to follow. But these disciples had been loyal to John. They had put their lot with him. So it would take quite an endorsement for those disciples to move from one leader to another. Clearly, they heard enough in that glowing endorsement as we're told the disciples heard and they followed.

The second thing from the John 1 text I focused upon was the question: *What are you looking for?* Easter brings a lot of images to the forefront. One that tends to be poignant for me is the suffering Christ on the cross. That he could – in the end of life – forgive those who were hurting him (by word, by deed) is an amazing thing to me. But there was a lot of suffering going on; Jesus suffering in the Garden as he prayed to have this burden taken away before accepting it; the Son asking the Father, **"Why have you forsaken me?"** The Son making arrangements for his earthly mother to be taken care of, another hard thing. So, often the suffering Christ is what I look for. But maybe not this year. How about you? What do you need to see...or see again...this season to rekindle or embolden your faith?

Later on, John the Baptist is in jail, discouraged, and in Luke 7 he asks disciples to go back and ask Jesus, "Are you the one who is to come or should we look for someone else?" And Jesus sends back the message that he has done certain things (giving sight to the blind, cleansing lepers, raising the dead, giving Good News to the poor, etc.) and John would know that his faith was not in vain.

The third question that caught my eye from this text was the two disciples asking Jesus, **"Where are you staying?"** And the reply by Jesus was intriguing too: **'Come and see.'** 

The disciples had gotten a pretty good testimonial about the Savior. However, it might take more than just hearing Jesus teach to move them to become fullfledged disciples. This short text in John 1 brings to light the relational aspect that would ultimately draw disciples to the Savior. And there are no promises by

Jesus, no loud platitudes about how great he'll be to follow. He offers them a look at who he is – Come and see. And they would remain with him that day and, after doing so, were intrigued enough to tell friends about the Lord.

The fact is, many people who know ABOUT Jesus don't *know* Jesus. It's the difference between being a baseball fan and knowing the statistics of a favorite player and actually hanging out with them. Jesus offers that opportunity; Revelation 3:20 reminds us, **"Behold, I stand**

at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in and eat with them and they'll eat with me."

So while some of your friends, family and neighbors may know some of the Jesus story on Easter; where they're staying (spiritually) might be quite far from the door Jesus is standing right outside of. We have the chance to ask those we know where they're staving and walk with them as they experience Jesus. One of the ways we can do that this season is by handing them a postcard, inviting them to celebrate Easter with us on April 17, 2022. These postcards will be available in the foyer soon for handing out.

For me, the beginnings of the ministry of Jesus here in John 1 brought a perspective that will help me see the end parts more memorably. If that isn't your catalyst for a new look at the season, try the New Testament gospels -Matthew chapter 21, and chapters 26-28; Mark 14-16; Luke 19-24; and John 13-21

give the Easter week story and events after the resurrection.
