### A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Ellie: "Mom!" (Mom ignores daughter. Continues paying bills at computer.)

Ellie: "Mom!"

Me: (snapping) "What!!" Ellie: "Mom, I'm hungry."

I march grumbling to the kitchen to make dinner. Interrupted again! (end scene)

I had the privilege of attending the Covenant's triennial conference for women a few weekends ago in Minneapolis, along with Eleanor Greenwall and Pat Everingham. We heard great speakers and worshipped with around 700 other women from around the Covenant—even around the world.

I wanted to share a little bit with you about the new structuring the Covenant at large is doing that hopefully will show that every aspect of ministry in Christ's church should include and encourage women to take part according to their Holy Spirit given gifts.

Many of you are familiar with the old title, "Covenant Women," that was changed to "Women's Ministries" several years ago. Now there is no longer a department with the word "women" in it. That is not to diminish the importance of women in ministry however, it is to show that women are important in every aspect of ministry. Marilyn Williams has taken a new position called "Director of Women's Initiatives." She will be working closely with the directors of the five ministry areas of the Covenant: *Make and Deepen Disciples, Serve Globally, Start and Strengthen Churches, Develop Leaders, and Love Mercy Do Justice*, to insure that women and women's initiatives are included in every aspect of those ministries.

What did I get out of the conference? I'm glad you asked! I loved all of our speakers, but one in particular spoke to me more than the others. Friday evening we heard from Megan Fate Marshman, director of women's ministries at Hume Lake Christian Camp in California. She shared about how she had to learn to become interrupt-able. She told the story of how she was on an airplane, needing to work on a talk she was preparing for a conference, and put in her earbuds to deter anyone from talking to her. But there was a man sitting beside her who noticed she was typing something "Christian" and asked her if she was a "Christian." She didn't want to talk to him so briefly took her earbuds out to say, "yes I am," and then she put them back in so he would get the hint that she didn't want to talk. But he kept talking to her and she finally took off her earbuds and listened to him and they ended up having a great conversation about his daughter and Jesus. She said she needed to learn to be interrupt-able by the Lord because she might miss out on an opportunity for ministry if she didn't. That convicted me because I often get into the zone on whatever I'm working on and don't want to be interrupted. (e.g. the conversation I opened with.) Continued on Page 2

We need to allow God to interrupt us in our lives because His work is always more important than our own. Megan said something to the affect of, "do you ever get so busy *doing* God's work that you miss out on DOING God's work?"
