# A Word From the Pastor

One of my favorite Christmas stories is "A Christmas Carol" by Charles Dickens. I've seen it in done dramatically in children's theaters, a few regional playhouses and Chicago's Goodman Theatre. I've also watched an old black and white video of it and most recently a computer animated film starring Jim Carrey as the dark and miserly Ebenezer Scrooge.

If you haven't read or heard the story, "A Christmas Carol" is about a businessman who has no Christmas spirit. He pays his colleague a pittance and doesn't give a rip about his family. He is such a cold person that he can work in a freezing office, hardly using the coal he has to warm his building. He's unwilling to give to charity, unaware of the needs around him, and unable to change his habitual dour demeanor. The story goes that he is visited by three spirits as he tires to get a night's rest.

Visitor 1 is The Ghost of Christmas Past. He gives Scrooge a look at his childhood and at a couple of key turning points in his young adulthood. Scrooge came from a tough background, but he met a mentor that gave him an opportunity to see the world differently. He meets a young woman that offers him a chance to change his perspective. But he misses the opportunity.

Later in the evening, Visitor 2 arrives, The Ghost of Christmas Present. This spirit reminds Scrooge of what is currently occurring right under this nose. He gets a small glimpse of a few people that might benefit from a little compassion and intervention from him, people that could find a place in their hearts for Scrooge if he gave them an opening.

Finally, Visitor 3 arrives, The Ghost of Christmas Future, who shows Scrooge a tombstone that offers—ironically—hope. This time has not come yet, the final word hasn't been written on the grave, it might change. When Scrooge is awakened on Christmas morning he knows that he must not waste his second chance. And in the final scene, the changed man does something WAY out of character; he makes an apology to his closest family member, one who had tried to show kindness to him many times and was rebuffed over and over. He also makes restitution with his colleague and pays him what he's worth.

Along with recommending a viewing of "A Christmas Carol" this season, I'd like you to consider learning from this story. Scripture tells us that, like the Dickens tale, three visits by spirits were vital to the Advent Season. The first (Gabriel) came to a man named Zechariah (Matt 1:5-25; 57-80). The angel told him his elderly wife Elizabeth would give birth to a son that would announce the way for the Messiah. Zechariah didn't believe the angel and God muted him so that he could not speak until his son was born.

# A WORD...(CONTINUED)


Gabriel's second visit was to a virgin named Mary. She would soon marry a man named Joseph (Matt 1:26-56). Her response was different from Zechariah's. When Mary was told about her role in the birth of the Savior she said, "May it be to me according to your word." She was ready to play her part and I hope you are to this season. The fact is, you may have a part to play as Christ's instrument in your community as the Christmas story is told. Perhaps it's in reconciling with a family member. Maybe it's in showing love to the outsiders in your sphere of influence. Or could it be that you will be asked for something else from God?

Finally, a third spirit-filled vision came to shepherds in the fields (Matt 2:1-20). When God's glory shone, they were terrified, but when the incredible story of the Messiah was told, they hurried off to worship this baby. And when they saw, they told others and they were amazed. Why? Shepherds were lowly people, dirty, uncouth, not well thought of. But their story was so compelling it didn't matter WHO told it. "God With Us" showed up and the shepherds were affected forever. It didn't matter how they were perceived; they HAD to worship the babe and they were willing to go to great lengths to do so.

How badly do you want to worship the Christ this season? We all have busy lives with family and holiday planning and parties and fun things going on. I challenge you to put Jesus before all of that, making worship a priority, not just at Christmas but every day of the year.


