Advent: a time to wait

Advent is a time that we wait – we wait for God to come again to us – and in the Matthew 1 story of the birth of Christ, we're told (1:23), "the virgin will conceive and give birth to a son and they will call him 'Immanuel,' which means 'God with us."

But the fact is, during 2020, Immanuel arrived on multiple fronts throughout the seasons. It started in early January, with a funeral service for a longtime parishioner. Terry Randell was remembered well, with a packed building, a poignant testimony from Terry's son, and a bagpipe player and a salute by the local American Legion providing added meaning.

During the winter, a Kids Club program was a fun Wednesday night option for some of our kids from church, with faithful volunteers making the ministry enjoyable. And while that was going on, our confirmation class was in full gear, with four students eventually finishing their two-year studies.

In March, something that wasn't so pleasant gave us a chance to see "God with us" in action. Co-Vid-19 came with a vengeance and affected the world markedly. But while larger cities were seeing hospitals packed with patients and the elderly succumbing to the virus, our county was relatively free of illness during the spring, even as schools closed off in-person learning and masks on faces became commonplace and diners decreased in attendance.

In June, we got a pleasant surprise in the midst of the pandemic that affected the world for much of 2020. The governor of Nebraska said that ball fields could be used for American Legion baseball and our local team was fortunate enough to play without incident for eight glorious weeks. We played well, our team had exemplary attitudes, and no one (no kids, no families, or umpires) got Co-Vid.

In mid-July, we traveled to Texas to celebrate the 59th anniversary of my mother and father-in-law. Along with that, my mother-in-law blessed all of the grandkids and great grandkids at her home and they were powerful events that warmed my spirit even when we were forced to quarantine in our home following a family reunion and the positive test of a family member. And while we watched from our living room window the next week, our Vacation

Bible School went off without a hitch, as people from church and from other congregations took responsibility for a week that ministered to some 30 children.

In mid-August, we had a worship service and the family of two players I'd coached this past summer in American Legion showed up at church. Our service was especially meaningful and at the service's end, the mother of those players told me that – in experiencing what I'd experienced that morning – "her heart was full." So was mine.

On the last Sunday in August, a painful bit of news had just come to my wife's phone and we were scrambling to figure out what to do. My mother-in-law was in the late stages of her life and Mary had returned from their home the night before and knew her mom might not be long for this earth. And in a span of 30 minutes, one person took responsibility for the following week's worship service, another person put gas in our car and a third provided money that aided our trip.

This fall, three Cross County Schools students warmed my heart while watching their exploits on the athletic fields and gymnasiums around here. Two of those students played football, brothers actually, and they were stellar – turning in top-notch performances during an unbeaten regular season after a period this summer where they may've doubted they'd even get to play. I felt, as I watched, that God seemed to just put a hedge of protection around our area's football and volleyball teams, allowing them to win District and Conference titles respectively, but even more, to allow kids who'd worked so hard to have a chance to see their work pay off.

The other student, my daughter, played junior high volleyball. She'd practiced all summer with a young lady

across the street, made improvements, and felt good about her efforts. She even managed to earn a driver's permit this fall as well.
