I was thinking of our newest leadership team members – Linda Johnson, Dianne Nielsen, Cheryl Erickson, and Mark Hanson – this past week. In November, our nominating team including Mary Wadell and Charles and Neeli Noyd had talked about a list of people that we'd considered in finding four slots. We had two people going off the team (Robert Orsborn and Dave Schramm), but we had room for two additional members, so we worked with that in mind.

When you consider a mix of people to help provide lay leadership at a church, it's not just about finding competent folks; it's also about combining experience with availability and praying that the Spirit's movement will meld personalities and provide the wisdom needed to collaborate with pastors and generate ministry in love. If that sounds like it's complicated stuff, I think it is. But it's also a wonderful thing when things work out, and it can even border on the spectacular.

About a decade ago, in Paxton, IL, a half dozen churches combined resources with board members and volunteerism in starting a food pantry in a town of 4,500. A handful of pastors provided board leadership, we found a space to house the pantry at a local radio station and we served people five days per month. Our different theological perspectives on issues were non-issues as we shared a passion for helping needy people and my five years on the board were among the highlights of ministry there. In a normal context, I might not have gotten to know those people, but we found common ground in service and my regard for those folks grew exponentially.

However, since starting in ministry some three decades ago, I see the same thing almost every week or hear about something someone did that is really amazing. It occurred in California, in Iowa, in Illinois and Ohio, and is no different in Nebraska, people that seem ordinary doing incredible things, sometimes alone, sometimes in conjunction with others.

- \* I think of the daughter and son-in-law that cared for aging parents for many years with nary a break.
- \* The guy who went into enemy territory as an ambulance driver during the Korean War and saved people with triage skills when he was barely collegeaged.
- \* The handful of folks with EMT or fire-fighting skills who help save lives as volunteers in our county.
- \* How about the parents that have given tremendous care to their children, some of whom have profound special needs?
- \* Spouses that give daily attention to each other in trying circumstances.
- \* People that have dealt with physical or emotional crises (even near-death experiences) and have managed to persevere and even grow from them. And because some have been willing to tell their stories, we are blessed and God is honored through their words.
- \* Folks that have chosen to care for people in our society that are often neglected and mistreated, competent people that can sell houses, run businesses, teach and mentor our children, care for our elderly, provide quality medical care, or work with others in special ways that better society.

Sure, occasionally, you have that great performance that gets you on TV or earns you a write-up in the newspaper, or maybe you get something named after you or earn some sort of Man- or Woman of the Year honor (or become a King or Queen in these parts). But more often, it's the warm handshake, a grateful smile, the pat on the back, or even
