A Word From the Pastor

About a month ago, my wife let me buy a DNA kit from Ancestry.com. I'd been slowly gathering information about both sides of my family and about six weeks ago I talked to a cousin I hadn't talked to for 15 years; she convinced me to purchase this kit because she'd been able to find two half-sisters through the DNA tracking mechanism that tied certain DNA matter to family members.
