Thoughts on Life & Baseball



Most of you know I'm an assistant coach for SOS (Shelby, Osceola, Stromsburg) baseball again this year. I love baseball and I love coaching kids. In the past few weeks we've had multiple double headers so needless to say the game has been forefront in my mind lately. But more than that, it offers a good analogy of my life.

It's the ninth inning of my life. I've been out on the mound for what seems like forever, throwing pitch after pitch, straining to keep the many base runners from scoring against my life of sin. If it's not the errors in concentration that led to bases-on-balls, it's the utter failures of character that were the home runs that left the field, or those times of anger that led me to hit the batter with a pitch (80 miles per hour, right in the back, very painful, and at times I laughed inside as I thought of revenge).

But there were good moments too. I struck out my share of hitters as the talents God had given me had allowed me to be successful in my areas of expertise. Or, on those many occasions when my efforts really weren't enough, God intervened, giving me teammates along the way that helped me turn double plays that got me out of some of the bad innings of my life.

At various junctures, I didn't think I'd last very long. The early innings were tough sometimes as I learned how to figure out the strike zone of life. How ready I was to throw my glove at my teammates and yell at them for not matching my intensity. Then there was that rocky fourth inning in California when it didn't seem like I could do anything right. Or a few innings later, I lost my mind *(it seemed)* and I couldn't find my bearings and it took a well -chosen visit from my godly coach to settle me down and tell me things would be okay; and then just as it appeared my game would end, my opponent hit one right at the second baseman and I was able to get back to the dugout, take a breath, and regroup.

I've loved playing this game. I've enjoyed the competition, I've usually enjoyed my teammates and I've even enjoyed *getting ready* for the big games. I've always been a voracious reader, so learning about how to play the game was sometimes almost as fun as playing it. And, for the most part, practice has been fun; I know for many who play, practice might be only described as a necessary evil that gets them to the fun part, the actual games. But practice allows you to try some new things, to tweak your game a little, and when you put enough hours in with a good group of teammates you gain added respect for their part on your team.

But now that game is about over for me and I'm not sure I can get that last out. But I don't have to—as my coach comes to take the ball from me, he gives me a pat on the back, tells me I've done a good job and tells me to wait for the closer, the one who will finish the game and guarantee us the win. He runs in from the bullpen, full of confidence, determination on his face. I know this guy has paid the price to do His job. He's got the scars to prove it. And I know he's not afraid of anything, even death. As I leave the mound and head for the dugout, the crowd gives me a standing ovation because they know I've given my best. And as my teammates congratulate me, I turn and watch the closer do what he said he would do all along. Jesus has been there for as long as I can remember him and he's been a trusted teammate since junior high. At the end of the day, I know he'd be there for me and he has been.

This may not represent how your game of life has played out, but whatever analogy you use, please trust that the guy who is my ultimate closer is your ultimate Savior. Enjoy the summer, play the game right, and don't forget where the home field is, okay?
