A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

The food was great, the conversation was lively, the game was... inconsequential to the good vibe in the Pinley place.

It was a superb Super Bowl party that culminated a busy first month of ministry as pastors in Stromsburg, NE. More than two dozen came to the parsonage to enjoy football, fellowship, and food (not necessarily in that order) and it was an enjoyable four hours together. Kyle Mentick's funny dog stories in the kitchen; discussion about all sorts of topics downstairs in the Manly Man basement; getting to know a few others while watching the TV upstairs in the living room. Football trinkets procured by a few parishioners, full stomachs from the good 'snackage,' and one little boy ecstatic his favorite team won again.

The Lord Jesus, on the night he shared one last meal with his disciples before being crucified, prayed this prayer (John 16:11) to his father, "I will remain in the world no longer, but they are still in the world and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them by the power of your name, so that they may be one as we are one."

Our Super Bowl party reminded me that we will be better as a congregation by being together...in fellowship, in worship, in servanthood, in prayer, in the power of the Holy Spirit. Activities like this are informal ways to foster that kind of environment, but we hope that a formal ministry process could be even more effective.
