A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Paul writes in Eph 3:17-19 "And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, ¹⁸ may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, ¹⁹ and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God."

I love how Kelly puts this: "When we deeply plant roots into the love of Christ, we become standing trees who raise our branches in continual worship. We suck in the living water of Jesus Christ and are renewed with his life-giving nutrients, embraced by his creation and stand tall in adoration and appreciation."

We derive our strength from being deeply rooted into the heart of Christ. We deeply root ourselves by disciplining ourselves to pray and study God's word. Very few things worth doing or having in this life come easy, including a deep relationship with Christ, or anyone else for that matter. What relationship that is worth having is always easy?

But the relationship we have with Jesus, the one that gives us strength and helps us stand tall and strong, is planted and grown in the soil of God's word, his love, and his promises. His LOVE!
