

# A Word From the Pastor

Once upon a time (1816) there was a volcano named Mt. Timbaron in Indonesia and it blew up one day and for three years the whole world dealt with the consequences.

What happened was that the effect of this volcanic explosion began a climate change that made it frost every month in an area that is considered tropical. You can imagine what it did to farming in Indonesia, but it apparently had effects in Europe too. And when you added the Spanish Flu epidemic that occurred around the same time, it was a mess. It's been called a mini Ice Age and futurists are predicting the Coronavirus situation will have the same kind of lasting effects as the volcano on Mt. Timbaron did.

It's like the difference between a blizzard and winter. When a blizzard comes, you ride it out, stay inside a few days, try not to ruin your children's joy at no school, and if you're lucky you've stocked up ahead with necessities. But then it's over and you go back to life. Winter can't be dealt with in this way. You need a plan. You might not see your neighbors for five months, so you create ways to check in. A lot of frills go out the window and it's a disciplined process that gets it done so your sanity stays intact.

You can see my point, can't you? Because as futurists are looking at church, they're doing so with these kinds of analogies in mind. On May 4th, our county and some others in Nebraska will get to begin reducing the Coronavirus-related social restrictions and it will seem to some like everything's gonna go back to normal. It'll be like that brief blizzard has ended and spring is here and we can meet in large crowds and pretend that none of this social distancing thing was ever needed. We can all go to church just like before and be the church we have always been. And the experts are saying, "Think again."

First off, many folks are telling us that this pandemic won't really be over for 12-18 months, since we don't have a vaccine. Economic demands might deem that some adjustments are needed to get the workforce slowly back to normal, but there is far too much uncertainty with this illness to be assured all will be well soon. C'mon, as badly as we want to see Adrian Martinez, Hunter Miller and the boys at Memorial Stadium, are you sure you're ready to join 85,000 others in the stands in September?

Our conversations about church had a bit of a different tone last Sunday. Leadership team chair Dennis Nuttelman, Sue Rosenbaum of the leadership team, and Pastor Mary and I discussed the viability of our congregation meeting for worship in our building on May 10<sup>th</sup>. Legally, it might be an option; the 40-45 people that usually attend on a Sunday could reasonably put six feet of social distancing between each other, we could serve communion in a way that allowed people to receive the bread and cup, and I think the benefits of being together would be a pick-me-up that more than a few people would celebrate.

### Strengthen Faith, Cultivate Community, Care for Neighbors



Truth be told, I really could use a worship service together; I've missed you. But then what?

Who do we want to be from this point on? Some of the church futurists out there are saying that who we were *(the traditional church who does the traditional stuff)* will no longer be the paradigm. In their analogy, it'll be like a 20-slide business plan where only the first two or three slides will be applicable – who you are, what your mission statement is, maybe a target audience – because we'll have to rethink everything else. I think our leadership team has already begun to process this reality, but we will value more feedback for the congregation as a whole and we'll likely need more investment as we do so.

I'm preaching about the Holy Spirit during the month of May. And as I looked upon my text for May 10<sup>th</sup> (Acts 1:1-9), the paradigm shift that the disciples of Jesus were going through was every bit as culture-altering as what we're going through now. Jesus was leaving them – after all this good ministry, after the spectacular death/resurrection of the Lord, he was leaving, though not without a gift-giving party mentioned in Acts 1:4.

"Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about."

And clearly the followers of Jesus were hoping for more from Jesus, because they said to him, "Lord, are YOU at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?"

But Jesus had no intention of restoring something old – nor would it come through Him alone. So he replied (1:8), "But YOU will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and YOU will be my witnesses in Jerusalem (the hometown), and in Judea (Polk County) and Samaria (even those not you're your favorite people), and to the ends of the earth (believers and non-believers alike)."

WE will be those witnesses, but the world we witness to as the church will be different than before. I think we'll have to figure out how it'll differ but it is my hope that we will await God's direction with the fervent desire to be ready to integrate our witness into this changing climate together; for God's glory and people's good.
