Pastor Mary and I represented the Evangelical Covenant Church of Stromsburg as delegates to the 135th annual meeting of the Midwest Conference last Saturday as 121 delegates from 56 of the 100 churches or fellowship groups in the conference had a voice in the future business of our region's churches.

From a purely business standpoint, delegates approved the MWC's 2022 budget of \$740,181, up 3% from a year ago. One reason for the increase is the expected addition of a part -time staffer in the coming months to help with issues of church vitality. Another is the prioritization of \$51,500 for leadership development for laypersons and pastors in the conference. In the budget report, we were told that 90 of our 100 churches/fellowship groups gave consistently in 2021.

In her superintendent's report, Rev. Tammy Swanson-Draheim thanked churches and friends for the support given her during the four months following the passing of her husband Kelly on December 31st. Along with the support she's felt from so many, an encouragement to her has been the work of God in some goal-setting that had been done in 2017 for advocating more women leadership and more multi -ethnic churches. In 2017, a goal had been set to have 30 percent of congregations having leadership from women pastors; as of 2021, 24 percent of congregations have women leadership. In 2017, there were 11 multi-ethnic congregations and a goal was set to have 25 percent of our congregations being multi-ethnic (defined as having at least two people groups of at least 20 percent in a congregation). As of 2021, there are now 17 congregations in that aggregate, including nine Hispanic, a Sudanese and a Congolese congregation in that mix.

Growing and starting churches has certainly been a priority for the MWC in recent years and in our annual meeting, we recommended three congregations to be added to the Covenant membership (by approval at the June denominational annual meeting we now call "Gather."). They include Imani Restoration Covenant of Aurora, CO; Renovate Covenant of Centennial, CO; and New Life Covenant of Wichita, KS. Imani is a transplant church with a Kenyan pastor, Renovate has a pastoral couple (Susan and Greg Russell) and New Life is led by pastor Chad Pickering. Two churches in the MWC also closed – the ECC of Centerville, IA (which was formed in 1880) and New Day Covenant of Boulder, CO.

While we acknowledged how Co-Vid-19 has altered how

we've done ministry in our conference churches, one especially hopeful story came from Kansas City, where Engage Church has become the first Post-Covid congregation in our midst. While in-person services are the norm, Engage has managed to gather online worship service participation from 90 households hailing from six different states. Part of the reasoning for exploring such a paradigm is the recent statistics stating that 80 percent of our country espouses an interest in Jesus, but may not want to attend an in-person worship service. Two questions posed in light of this reality by a leadership cohort (represented by 24 churches) trying to envision the future church were (1) Are we becoming more like Jesus; and (2) Is the church more than a worship service?

As leadership in our conference churches grapple with how to lead during this pandemic-influenced stage of life, our denominational leadership is trying to reconfigure itself too. We discussed an upcoming vote to change our current administration into a Strategic Alignment Team at our denominational meeting in June. Some information has already been made available to pastors about this, but at 7 p.m. (CDT) on May 24th, a Zoom meeting will be made available to pastors and leadership teams to get a better handle on what this team will look like/function. As pastors with long Covenant roots and a stint working at denominational headquarters two decades ago, this kind of shift brings a skepticism for us, particularly knowing that there may be no central 'hub' from which our churches can glean information or help. Currently, our key administrators for the ECC are spread out all over North America, our president living in Oregon, an executive minister for Start & Strengthen Churches in Colorado, others elsewhere. So getting a better understanding of how to keep in touch will be important to us.

Among the tasks of delegates was to vote for new leadership on our MWC executive board and the boards of three camps. Among those we approved for our conference executive board is Jill Craig, a child of the church now a pastor in Wakefield, NE. Among those approved for the Midwest Covenant Home board is our own Sue Rosenbaum. We also approved new board members for Covenant Cedars Camp in Hordville, NE and learned that a new executive director, R.J. Bacani, has been named and will start his position on May 1.

Current executive director Dan Burr (21 years in that role) will help in the transition for a time and filling staff in

maintenance and registration (which had been the role of Dan's wife Becky) are among the early logistical points of interest, along with putting together a summer staff. Delegates also approved 10 candidates to be given final approval for ordination at the June annual denominational meeting – among them is longtime friend Lynn Black of Countryside Covenant of McPherson, KS.

For pastors, the news that upcoming fall pastor/spouse retreats are being planned as in-person events was met with relief. In our region, ours will be held November 2-4 in Ashland, NE at a retreat center. Next

year's annual meeting will occur April 29-30, 2022 at Christ Community Covenant Church in Arvada, Colorado. As a FYI, Pastor Mary and I also were part of our annual conference Ministerium meeting last Saturday morning, which is necessary for us to keep credentialed in the denomination.

The Evangelical Covenant Church is a denomination that includes 897 congregations throughout North America within 11 conferences, with missionaries represented in 59 countries. 


Isaac Noyd
