# A Word From the Pastor

A couple of weeks ago we had an interesting dialogue pertaining to a community event being held on a pagan holiday – and in God's sense of humor, the event was changed from Halloween to All Saints Day because the local high school had a football home playoff game.

But the conversation was telling in that a number of people passionately told of their desire to see our church find ways to get more 'out in the community.' As I stated during our "Talk Back" Sunday conversation, the pastors at this church aren't going to determine this congregation's ministry agenda – you are. And it was encouraging to note that the community event in the public square would get the church's support, along with a mission trip to Louisville, KY next summer and a soup supper next week (Nov. 5). We're hoping to also provide a meal at the Swede Haven neighborhood later in November and I'm confident our Outreach team will think up a few more options for us to move from within the church's walls out onto the highways and byways of Polk County and beyond.

The fact is, we're part of a denomination, the Evangelical Covenant Church, that is all about getting out in the community and perhaps it's worth some newsletter space to alert you to some of the ways the ECC does this around the world. Last week, we received a ministry report that highlighted some of those interesting ventures.

ECC president John Wenrich made a trip to Congo recently and discovered that a water project sponsored through our SERVE GLOBALLY ministry arm is providing needed drinking water to some 57,000 people in the city of Gemena, where medical mission ministries have gone on for decades (a similar initiative is being formed for Yemen, via the ECC's Covenant World Relief). There is also a new maternity ward at one hospital, along with added training that has aided hospitals in two other sites. A new venture to help people in Congo is the Karawa Coffee Project, which helps train 1,400 coffee producers in agronomy and business practices while providing seed and plant transferring to bolster the coffee production process. It was John's first trip to our Africa mission outpost and he was amazed by the work going on in the Covenant Church in Congo, which has more people worshiping on a Sunday than our North American churches. Moreover, 176 indigenous churches have been started in the African country of Mozambique and another 50 tribal churches have

been planted within the low caste systems of Asia, many in India.

The India church plants are particularly compelling, given that in many situations the churches are ministering within a poor and abusive system that seemingly gives people no way out of their situation. The Hindustani Covenant Church has done Human Trafficking ministries of justice and mercy, for example, with people ministering to the children of prostitutes and bringing them to a saving relationship with Jesus while providing saving practical helps to women needing to leave highly dangerous professions. Some of this information was given to Pastor Mary by Boaz Johnson, who taught a group of ministers at a retreat last month and told of his own childhood in India and some of the amazing redemptive ways ministry is occurring in India. The LOVE MERCY DO JUSTICE arm of the ECC is helping with similar types of ministry closer to home via an Advocacy for Victims of Abuse (AVA) program in North America. Training is being given and AVA teams created for local churches to help in their own communities as they deal with a problem far more wide-spread than meets the eye.

Another unique form of advocacy is being provided through one of our denominational schools, North Park Theological Seminary. A certification program has been formulated to allow 38 prisoners at Stateville Correctional Center, located a couple of hours from Chicago, to receive theological training. Last year, Christian recording artist Lauren Daigle performed there after hearing about some of the educational work done there and that provided a little needed publicity, but the ministry has had impact inside the walls and outside because prisoners are taking some of the Master of Christian Ministry courses with non-incarcerated students in a cohort that engages them in dialogue together.




