Then when on a visit to my parents' - who still lived in California at the time—my mom and I went shopping for wedding decorations. Craig always jokes with me now that he and my mother were on the same wave length regarding our colors and I was way off base.

In the long run it was a beautiful wedding and I still use some of those decorations 20 years later when decorating for fall.

I never used to think of Fall being a season of new beginnings. It was always Spring that was touted as being the new life season. But for the church and school year, Fall is the season of new beginnings. Kids go back to school...a new grade...new teachers. And we begin Christian Formation ministries anew. Again, new grades, new offerings, maybe new teachers.

We are offering some new things in the way of Christian Formation this fall. Craig and I encourage you and your families to take part in them.

We've already begun our Kingdom Kids Wednesday night ministry in collaboration with Salem Lutheran church and the United Methodist Church. We have averaged around 25 kids so far grades pre-k through 6th. We are thrilled to have so much interest and commitment of our kids.

We have kicked off our Elevate youth ministries with pizza and a movie and we had 7 kids, including some new ones. We are planning a trip for our 7th—12th graders to Vala's Pumpkin patch this month. It is a little pricey so we are asking each kid to pitch in a certain amount and they are going to raise the rest with a baked potato bar on October 10th right after worship. This is a great event for our kids to bring friends to. Ellie already has some friends interested in going with us.

We have begun Sunday studies again. Adults and youth are meeting at 9:30 and children are being invited to Children's church during the second half of our 10:30 worship service.

Over 20 years ago, the Covenant changed the name "Christian Education" to "Christian Formation" because the former was too limiting. Christian Formation is more than head knowledge; it indicates holistic learning—head, heart, and hands, and it's a continual process, a journey of a lifetime, which is what we as Christ-followers are called to. We don't ever "arrive" as perfect people until we get to heaven. In our youth Sunday School class we've begun a study on the book of James that's called "Faith Works." When we follow Jesus day by day our good works follow because we are in fellowship with him, being formed by him and the Holy Spirit in our lives.

We are trying to offer opportunities for all ages to grow in their relationships with Jesus. It's not enough to just attend church for one hour on Sunday mornings. This world puts many pressures on us to conform to its ways but we're reminded by Paul in Romans 12:2 "Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is..."

There are opportunities for Christian Formation here. If you don't find one of the options we are offering to fit in your schedule, find another one. Join a community Bible Study. There is a men's group that meets at the Coffee Shop on Tuesday nights. There are women's

Bible Study Fellowship groups that meet three different times and ways during the week. I know there are other Bible studies going on. If you can't find one that fits for you talk to Craig or I.

Start something new this Fall! Determine to kick your spiritual life up a notch so you can be salt and light to a world that needs Jesus.
