"A few days ago Jesus called on me..."

"The people that make up this Body of Christ are not perfect, but they have been perfectly placed in my life."

The first quote came from a letter to me by a parishioner who'd revived a lady after she'd had a heart attack at home. The second came from a testimony given by a man who'd joined the church where I'd served previously, thanking God for people that helped him renew his faith in Jesus.

There are a variety of other stories about God's goodness in the letters and cards I've saved over my ministerial career. Some refer to ways certain people from the congregation had cared for them during a tough time; others were testimonies of how they'd seen God at work in their families, their workplaces, or their church. And whether or not a congregation is perfect or not, there is always God moving in people, His Spirit moving, his beloved responding.

And so it is that the Apostle Paul writes to a group of faithful followers in the midst of a big city, Philippi, reminding them early in his letter, **"I thank my God every time I remember you..."**

If there is a book in the New Testament to find encouragement from, this one is it. And as I consider my first full-time church ministry experience serving from an individual church (Hillside Covenant Church, Walnut Creek, CA, as a youth ministries intern 30 years ago), I think back to all the times God worked through his people and blessed me either as a pastor or a parishioner.

Thankfully, I do this reminiscing from a desk in a church office; Paul was doing his under house arrest in the city of Rome. But Paul wasn't alone in his task – a co-signer of the letter to the Philippians is the young man he mentored, Timothy, and others were around him either constantly or occasionally as he waited to see if he'd ever be set free from the charges against him.

Thirty falls ago, I wasn't alone either, although I was single. As I arrived from Chicago, there were 25 kids in our junior high group on Wednesday nights that I was to oversee as an intern; I also helped the full-time youth pastor with the high school group on Thursday nights, a contingent of 30. It's been fun to hear about what some of those 'kids' are doing now. Two are in full-time church ministry, one that I'm in touch with is a teacher, and some are still part of the church and living nearby. I got to know many of the parents of those young teens and years later some of those adults were helpful to me in crisis and continue to be solid *Continued on Page 2*

members of that congregation. I'm also glad for the part I got to play in being the 'guinea pig' for a junior high youth pastor. After one more intern, the church decided to add a position to bolster their ministry to youth and families.

It works the other way too. I'm still in touch with my home church, whose lead pastor is a friend of ours from Chicago. They remember me as that kid they taught Sunday school to and I'm part of their ongoing legacy as a teacher in the faith to future generations. As you read further into the book of Philippians, you can imagine Paul thinking of certain people he'd gotten to know on a couple of previous trips into the region, recalling the good things that occurred, praying that they could endure harder things when their faith would be tested. It's no wonder Paul calls this congregation, **"my joy and crown."**

On September 22nd, we will begin our fall sermon series from the book of Philippians, Paul's letter to a congregation he has high hopes for. I've included the sermon texts to the right, in case you want to read ahead.

But we're also excited about what's occurring before our fall series starts, as we have a kick-off Sunday for our kids and adults Sunday school classes that we hope will draw people closer to Jesus too. So join us – and invite friends.
